Skills targeted General learning objectives	<p>This module pursues the objectives of the module <i>Visual Art Photography I</i>. In-depth research into and knowledge of contemporary photographic creation, development of new forms of shooting, use and enhancement of the photographic medium. The visual and formal experiments are presented as objects, installations and/or in print.</p>
Teaching content and form	<p>a) Materialize Photography (6 x 8 periods & 1 block week): based on group meetings and individual consultations, the course reviews the stages involved in developing a project to display and materialize photographic images as well as its finalisation in terms of presentation and argumentation.</p> <p>b) Photo Books / Self Initiated (6 x 8 periods): students develop their work around a theme defined in collaboration with the professor. They produce their photo editing project in a coherent editorial form (edition, website, magazine, etc.) or develop a freely chosen art project.</p>
Forms of assessment and validation	<p>A jury will assess projects undertaken at the end of the semester. The assessment may take students' regular attendance at classes and lectures into account. To obtain credits, students must obtain an average mark of at least 4.</p>
Remedial teaching	<p>Remediation is possible by working to make good observed shortfalls. Module repeated in the academic year following a fail mark, according to procedures to be agreed with the director of the module. No remediation possible after repeating the module.</p>
